Turkey exempts foreign tourists in the country from ongoing curfew restrictions

Turkey, which is under lockdown until May 17, has decided to exclude foreign travellers from curfew, who are already in the country. Mehmet Nuri Ersoy, Culture and Tourism Minister, Turkey assured foreign visitors that they are exempt from the round-the-clock curfew. Foreign visitors will be able to carry out their activities provided that they have their passports with them. Public transportation will continue to operate at 50% capacity. Major museums and historical sites across 9 cities, including Istanbul, Antalya, Mugla and Nevsehir (Cappadocia) will be open to foreign visitors during the lockdown.

RT-PCR not needed for travel within states: ICMR

The Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) has advised removing the need for an RT-PCR test for

PCR test in healthy individuals undertaking inter-state domestic travel may be completely removed to reduce the load on laboratories," the government's flagship bio-medical research agency said in its advisory.

Nepal bans all domestic & international flights until May 14

Nepal has banned all domestic and international flights until May 14 due to increasing COVID-19

cases. Nepal's Health Minister Hridayesh Tripathi has stated that the decision on flight restrictions will be in place until May 14, but charter flights will be allowed. Nepal has made



quarantine mandatory for everyone arriving in the country. Those flying in from abroad will be subject to mandatory 10-day quarantine in hotels upon arrival.
